

First Aid/Emergency Kit Supply List

The following are suggested items to include in your first aid kit. We HIGHLY recommend carrying everything listed in the basic kits below, with the additional items if you plan to hike in remote areas. Emergency services in the Caucasus are neither fast nor super reliable, especially in remote regions, so you need to be prepared to manage emergencies on your own.

BASIC EMERGENCY

- emergency blanket
- 🗆 headlamp
- PLB/satellite communicator
- 🗆 whistle

BASIC CARE/FIRST AID

- antiseptic towelettes
- antibiotic ointment packets
- □ blister treatment (moleskin dressings)
- fabric bandages of various shapes and sizes
- □ 3x4 sterile gauze pads
- □ 4x4 sterile gauze pads
- hydrocortisone ointment packets
- □ 1"-wide medical tape
- □ pain relief medication
- □ safety pins
- 🗆 sunscreen
- 🗆 hand sanitizer
- 🗆 tincture of benzoin swabs
- tweezers

WRAPS/BANDAGES

- □ 4-6 inch elastic wrap
- □ 3-inch conforming roll gauze
- □ self-adhering bandage (e.g. Coban® Wrap)
- \square stiff material for splints (e.g. SAM R splint / trekking pole)
- \Box transparent film dressings
- 🗆 triangular bandages
- wound closure strips

MEDICATION

- □ aloe vera gel
- 🗆 antacids
- 🗆 anti-diarrhea medicine (e.g. Imodium)
- \Box antihistamines
- □ aspirin
- \Box electrolyte powder
- 🗆 glucose/ sugar
- \square laxatives
- \Box oral rehydration salts
- $\hfill\square$ personal prescription medications
- $\hfill\square$ povidone-iodine solution

TOOLS

- □ duct tape
- □ first aid guide/instruction booklet
- □ gloves
- \Box 12cc irrigation syringe
- □ pencil & paper
- \square oral thermometer
- \square rescue/CPR mask
- sterile scrub brush
- \square needle and thread
- 🗆 trauma shears

- Check the expiration dates on your medications and note specific additional needs that you or your trip might require.
- Before you begin your hike, go through each item in your kit and familiarize yourself with how to use it.
