The <u>Transcaucasian Trail Association (TCTA)</u> is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization established in 2016 that coordinates and supports the development of the Transcaucasian Trail (TCT). We work in close partnership with local NGOs and partners in <u>Georgia</u>, <u>Armenia</u>, and <u>Azerbaijan</u> towards our shared vision.

Our vision is a **world-class, long-distance hiking trail** that follows the Greater and Lesser Caucasus Mountains and connects diverse communities and ecosystems, providing lasting and wide-ranging benefits for people and the environment.

Our mission is to **develop**, **promote**, **and maintain the TCT** in order to improve access to the region's diverse cultural and natural heritage and encourage its preservation, benefiting local communities and trail users through the development of sustainable tourism.

In eight short years, the TCT has gone from being a wild idea to a vibrant reality with <u>trails</u>, <u>programs</u>, and a <u>community</u> that spans all three South Caucasus countries of Georgia, Armenia, and Azerbaijan. As it's grown, the trail has created opportunities for economic growth, cultural exchange, and environmental education with rippling benefits far beyond the trail itself.

Our Work & Impact

Bordering Europe, Asia and the Middle East, the region known as the South Caucasus is one of the most biologically, culturally and linguistically diverse regions in the world. Yet it's one that few have had the chance to explore. Most of the Caucasus' vast network of historical trails remains overgrown, unmarked, and unknown except to local villagers.

Together with a growing community of local and international trail builders, hikers, cartographers, and conservationists, **we're putting these hidden gems on the map** to help ensure that the landscapes and heritage of the region can be enjoyed by future generations.

To date, we've developed over **<u>1,700 kilometers of trail</u>**, trained hundreds of trail crew leaders & volunteers, and welcomed thousands of hikers to the TCT.



Recreational Infrastructure

We rehabilitate ancient trails and build new trail connections with safe, environmentally friendly infrastructure and accurate information, improving access to mountains and historical sites in a sustainable manner.



International & Domestic Tourism

We promote hiking and nature-based tourism in the Caucasus to a wide local & international audience, raising the profile of these spectacular areas and putting new destinations on the map.



Community Engagement

We work with communities to support local business development along the trail. Through our Caucasus Conservation Corps program, we train the next generation of conservation leaders, who will maintain these trails over the long term.

About the TCTA Board of Directors

The role of the Board is to raise **funds** to support the vision and mission of the TCTA, approve its **strategy**, and provide financial **oversight** of its operations. As independent directors, we provide assurance that donations are spent in a manner consistent with our mission and vision, and that the organization continues to qualify as a non-profit charity according to IRS rules.

Our contributions include leadership of fundraising programs and events, participation in strategy reviews, and review of financial plans and results. Overall, the board dedicates approximately half of its time toward strategy and half of its time toward fundraising. The board does not operate the TCTA; this is the role of the Executive Director and their team.
